Alderley House Circa 1831



Alderley House is situated on the Bucketts Way, halfway between Stroud and Booral.

It was built in 1831 for the Australian Agricultural Company (AA Co) using convict labour, for the AA Co's farrier and his family. The rendered brick building has verandahs front and back, timber columns, multi-paned windows and a hipped roof. Over the years the home has served many uses including a staging post for Cobb & Co, butchery, bakery, mid-wifery and a breeding property for the famous Waler horses used by The East India Company and The Australia Light Horse.

Local legend has it that bushranger Captain Thunderbolt once rested himself and his horses at Alderley House.

The story also continues to the affect that he had stolen the horses at Monkerai.

Restoration began on the old cottage in the early 1980's and over the past 25 years Alderley House has been saved from demolition and returned to its original glory.

Currently the property is operating as a Boutique style vineyard.
